	Liz Simmonds, Head of Research Culture
	Improving research culture is a major topic of discussion among universities in the UK and Europe, particularly with the inclusion of 'people, culture and environment' in REF 2029. However, it can often seem like the conversations focus on the experiences and challenges relating to individuals at the postdoc stage onwards, with postgraduate issues less prominent. At the University of Cambridge, we are keen to think holistically about our research culture, including the pipeline from postgraduate research students onwards, and all roles that contribute to the research endeavour. In this session, Liz Simmonds will talk about how the university is approaching its work on improving research culture, with a particular focus on activities and projects that are being led by postgraduate community or focus on ways to improve culture for the postgraduate community. There will be the chance to give some feedback about areas of research culture that you feel particularly affect postgraduates.
