Reflecting on my journey at Cambridge, first as a student pivoting between fields and later as a faculty member leading a pioneering course bridging the Arts and Sciences, I explore the complex dynamics of interdisciplinary identity. I share how initial struggles to find common ground evolved into a 'Big Picture' pedagogy, where translating technical concepts becomes a bridge rather than a barrier. Using AI for Sustainability as a case study, I demonstrate how mutual learning and embracing holistic perspectives can unlock innovative solutions and transform disciplinary isolation into impactful collaboration.</p> <p>Q&amp;A with Dr Ramit Debnath</p>
